Helen Maxine Hitsman Page, daughter of French Hitsman and Sadie Wight Hitsman, was born October 9, 1922 in Boone, Iowa and died February 12, 2015 at the Eastern Star Masonic Home in Boone, Iowa at the age of 92 years.

Helen grew up in the Boone County, Iowa area and graduated from Jordan Consolidated Schools in 1941. After high school, Helen went to work for First National Grocery and then later for Fareway. She later went to work for the Boone County Courthouse in the fishing license department. She then went to work for Boone State Bank, where she worked for 26 years.

On June 31, 1943, Helen was united in marriage to Melvin Page. They were the parents of one daughter Janis. They made their home in Boone, Iowa where Helen lived most of her life.

Helen had a love for gardening, she loved doing word searches and to read. She was a member of the First United Methodist Church in Boone, Martha Circle, V.F.W. Auxiliary, Order of the Eastern Star, and the American Legion.

Helen was preceded in death by her parents, her husband Melvin in 1993, her sister Hazel Contonwine, and 3 brothers: Eugene Hitsman, Robert Hitsman, and Verne Hitsman.
