Kenyon D. Hoffman, 82, of Boone, Iowa passed away at the Israel Family Hospice House in Ames, Iowa on Monday, morning, March 7, 2016. He was born on July 12, 1933 in Boone, Iowa the son of Howard and Marjorie (Davis) Hoffman. On July 21, 1955, he married Mary Hutson at the First Baptist Church in Boone. Kenyon graduated from Boone High School in 1951 and Drake University in 1956 with a Degree in Actuary Science. He was an actuary with the Iowa Insurance Commission and Life Investors. For 42 years, he was a Christmas tree farmer. Kenyon enjoyed fishing and the couple took numerous cruises throughout the years. He was a member of the First Baptist Church in Boone and the Iowa Tree Growers Association. Kenyon was a veteran serving in the Army during the Korean Conflict. His parents, Howard and Marjorie, and sister-in-law, Imogene Hoffman, preceded him in death. Surviving is his wife Mary of Boone; 3 sons Dan Hoffman of Marion, Iowa, Mark Hoffman of Cedar Rapids, Iowa and Paul Hoffman of Boone; a brother Dean Hoffman of Lubbock, Texas; and longtime family friend Kelly Bemus and Steve Emig both of Cedar Rapids, Iowa. Funeral services will be held on Wednesday afternoon, March 9th at 1:30 p.m. at the Stark-Welin Chapel in Boone with Pastor Janell Bloem officiating. A private interment service for the family will be in the Squire Boone Cemetery southeast of Boone. Visitations will be held at the Stark-Welin Chapel on Wednesday afternoon one hour prior to the time of service.
