“ “T”, I know it's been way too many years since we “hung out” together. I know we grew further apart as we started spending more and more time with our own families, but I hope you knew that your friendship was very important to me and I love you as a brother.

I'll never forget that summer day when I was in the backyard “tinkering” with my car. You were across the street visiting a neighbor of mine and you came across the street with your stingray, no not a car, but your stingray bicycle, to say hi. “Is that a '59 or '60 Chevy?” you asked. I said '60 Chevy. You told me your name was Tim but all your FRIENDS called you “T”. That was the day a great friendship began, and yes, I always knew you as “T”.

Anyone who knew you realized just how you loved your cars. I know you and I would cruise around for which seemed to be thousands of miles. You always liked doing all the driving. We talked about anything and everything that only true friends could talk about. That's how you build a true friendship! I remember one time when we just talked and talked and before we realized it, we ended up being in northern Missouri! Yes, we went through the best times anyone could imagine. But we also went through some of the frustrating, discouraging, and sad times and yes, even some mischievous times that one goes through in life as well. But I need to tell you, am very fortunate that you were there for me, because with you by my side, I just knew you and I would get through those tough times. And yes, we did have many, many great friends that shared those times with us as well.

And “T”, I’m sure you knew that you were always welcomed in our home. My parents, brothers, sisters, nieces, nephews, cousins etc. all knew you and thought of you as part of our family. Yes, the sad thing is that as the years passed, we did see less and less of each other, but you were always there for me throughout all these years when I needed you most---the loss of my parents, brothers and sisters. You were there for me and my family as late as December 30th of 2016, when you came to visit my brother who was in hospice care. After your visit, we got to once again share those very fond memories we had together; but the best part was afterwards we gave each other the biggest brotherly hug.
